SUBJECT: Iowa GED Statistical Report for Calendar Year 1999
(January 1, 1999 - December 31, 1999)

INTRODUCTION

The following information summarizes the major statistical trends relative to Iowa's GED testing program for calendar year 1999 (N=7,120).

STATISTICAL TRENDS

The following data summarizes some of the significant trends.

- 96 percent passed by Iowa state standards.
- 37 percent were in the process of testing.
- The average highest grade completed for Iowa's GED candidates is 10.0, as opposed to a national average of 9.9.
- The average age of Iowa's GED candidates is 24.7, as opposed to a national average of 24.3.

The following trends are based on total number of GED candidates who received diplomas during calendar year 1999, (N=4,544):

- 94 percent were direct referrals for GED testing from ABE/GED instructional classes.
- 83 percent indicated the two main reasons for taking the GED test were education/training and personal satisfaction: (63 percent education/training; 20 percent self satisfaction).
- 63 percent were between the ages of 18-29 (27 percent were between ages 18-19; 36 percent were between ages 20-29).
- 57 percent were male and 43 percent were female.

- 81 percent were majority and 19 percent were minority populations. [The 19 percent minority figure for GED candidates compares to an overall 5 percent minority population figure for Iowa's adult population age 16+.]
- 81 percent of diplomas issued for males were between ages 16-30, as opposed to 77 percent for females for the same age cohort.
- 19 percent of diplomas issued for males were between ages 31-60 as opposed to 22 percent for females for the same age cohort.

SUMMARY


The GED testing program in Iowa has traditionally sustained a 89-92 percent GED candidates' pass rate. Iowa has always ranked in the top ten states for GED candidates' pass rate. This high pass rate is an excellent testimony to the effectiveness of Iowa's ABE/GED instructional and GED testing delivery system. Iowa's high pass rate is due, to a large extent, to the fact that 94 percent of Iowa's GED candidates are direct referrals from the ABE/GED instructional component.

A comparison of total numbers of GED candidates tested in Iowa for calendar years 1980-1999 indicated the following trends:

- Historically, the total number of GED candidates tested peaked in calendar year 1981 (N=10,753). The volume consistently dropped through calendar year 1988. From 1989 through 1998, the volume has increased, on average between 2 and 3 percentage points annually.
- The overall pass rate was 96 percent. The overall state benchmark is a 92-95 percent pass rate.
- The percentage of candidates in the process of testing remained constant at 37 percent. This same percentage has held constant over the last several years.
- The number of Iowa High School Equivalency Diplomas issued in calendar year 1999 decreased 20 percent over calendar year 1999.

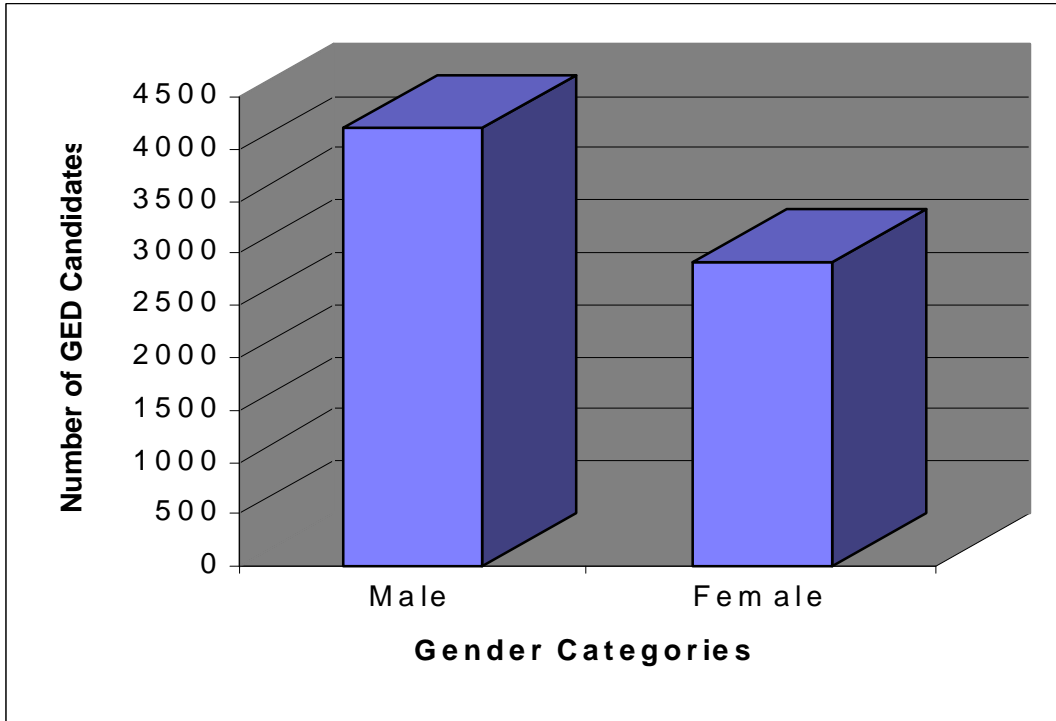

Number of Iowa GED Candidates by Gender Category for Calendar Year 1999

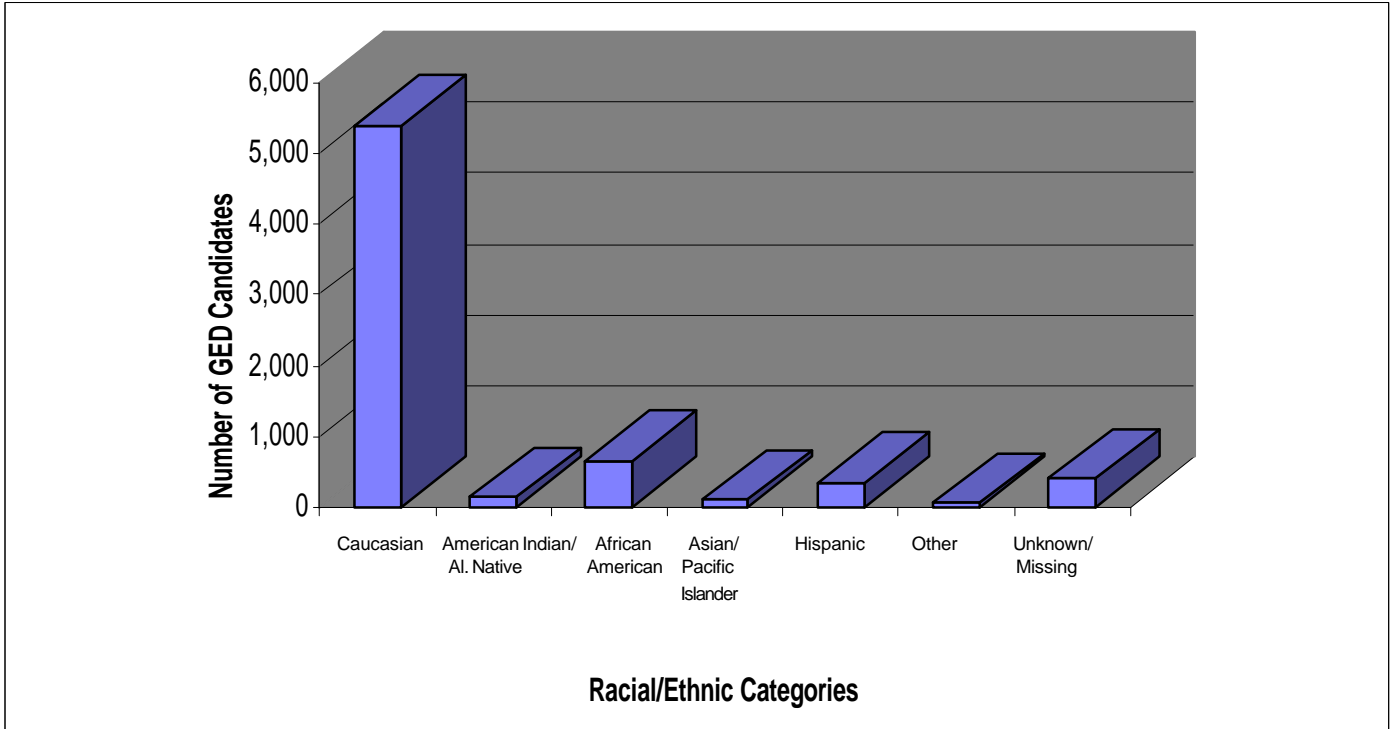

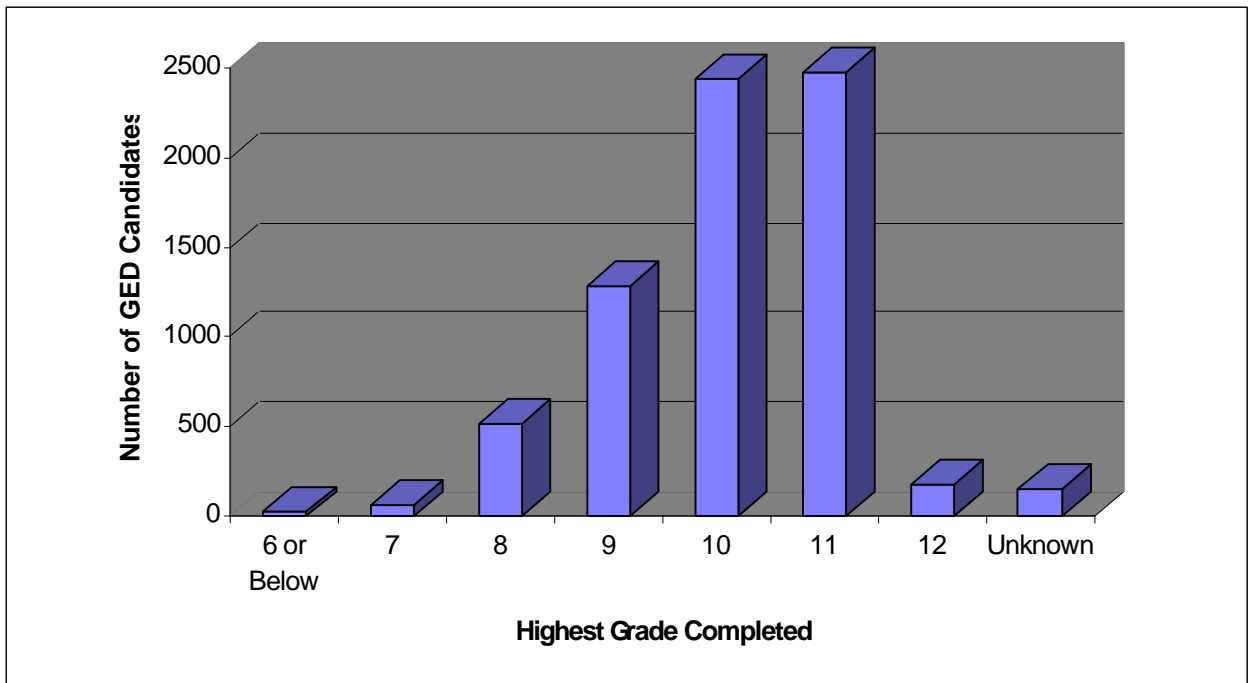

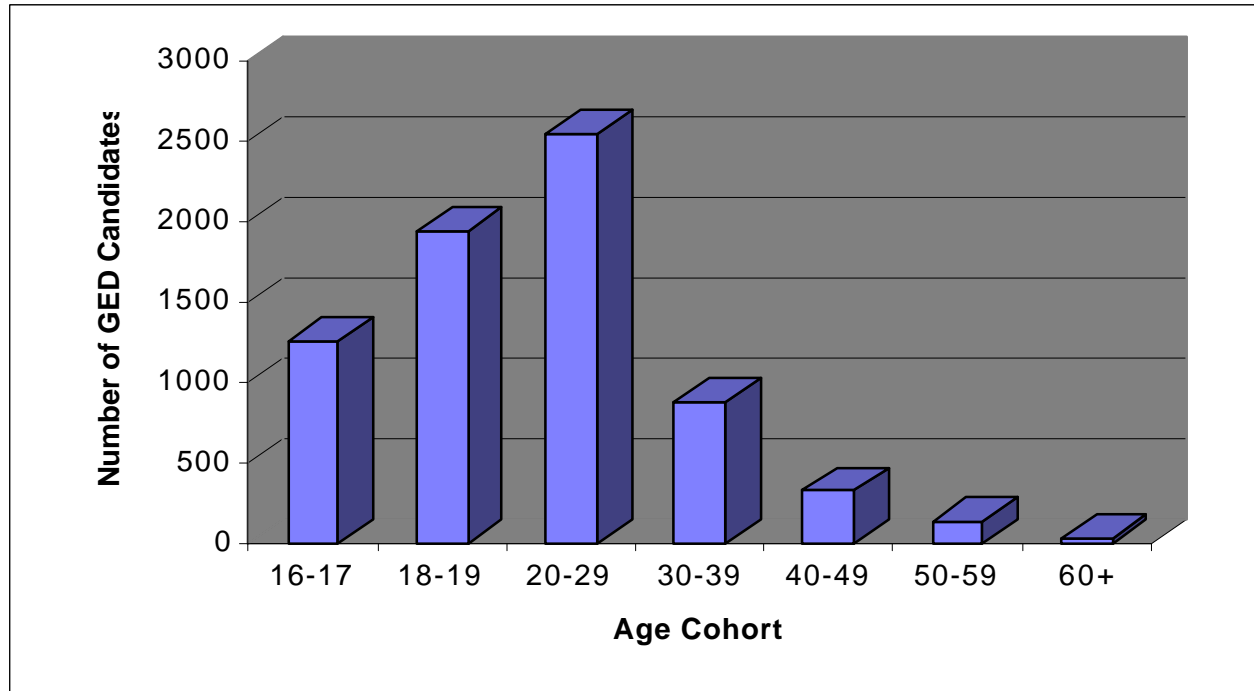

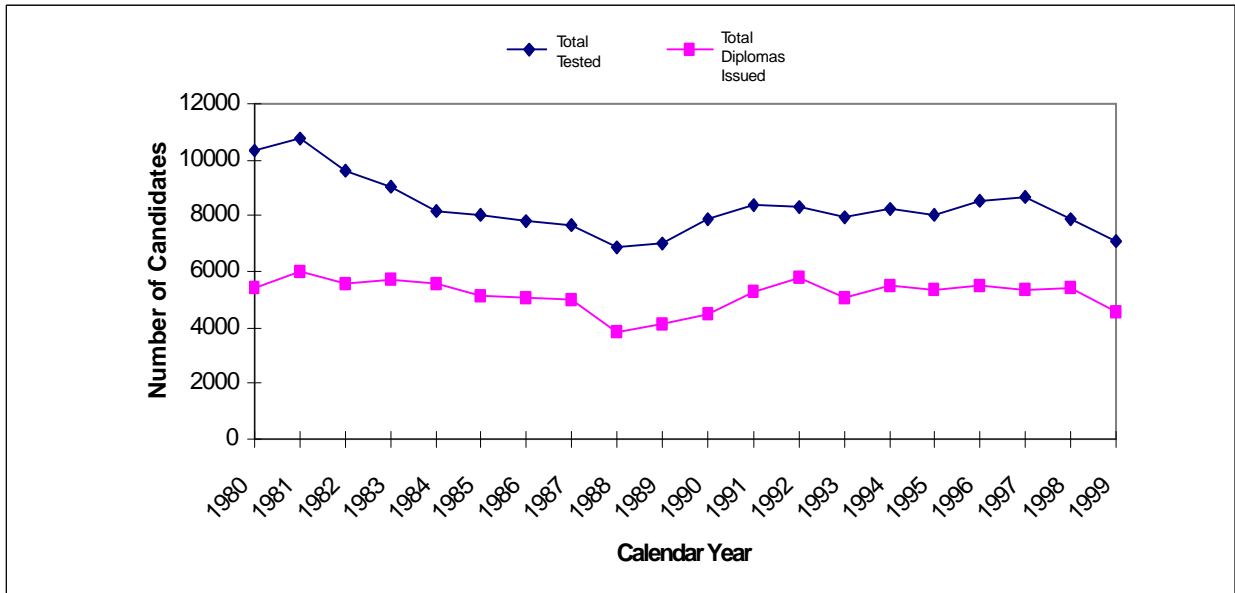

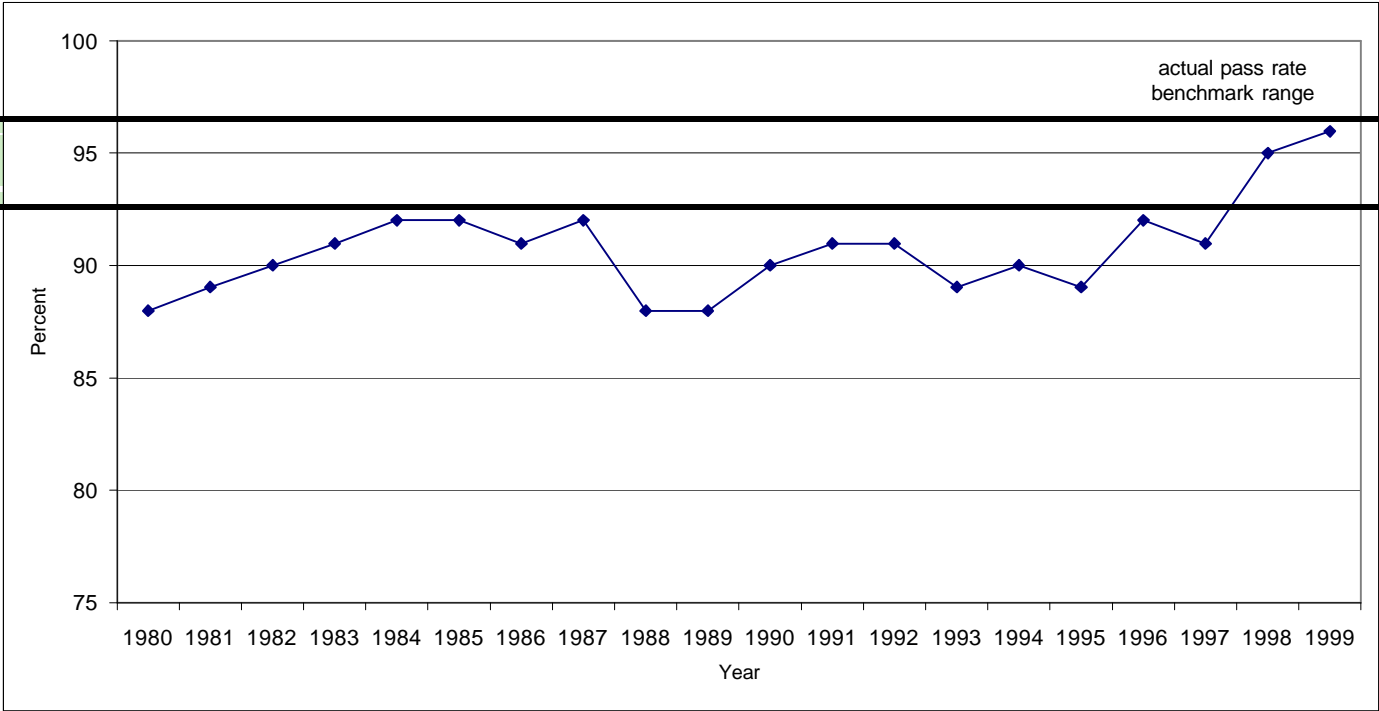
